

Activities - Traditional dancing for Kavango



The Kavango tribes are located along the Kavango River. There are five tribes and the people speak different dialects.

All the people like to dance and they start from young upto the oldest.

The music like sing and dance runs in their blood.

The Kavangos get skin from domestic animal for the drums, like cattle or goats.

They warm up the drums before they start playing.

During our traditional dances you can hear different types of songs such as

Morokeni - it's to open the show, Kambamba - a shoulder dance,

Suingi - songs from Angola.

All the songs, which they dance, are traditional from their old parents.

After the drum music the African people choir sing songs from the different churches.

The second last song, is Nkosi Sikelel 'iAfrica, the prayer for Africa. Then they close with Namibian National Anthem.

Again with drums the choir say good bye.
